he must have been distinct from the god of storms who for unknown reasons completely disappeared from greek religion and mythology by as early as the late bronze age from the time of homer zeus father appeared as a storm god the autocratic ruler of the universe and an offspring of elder deities on the level of mythology such a concept does not correspond to the traditional indo european patterns and seems to have been formed under the influence of near eastern concepts of the supreme almighty god on the one hand and the cretan minoan concept of a young god divine child on the other however the homeric concept of zeus was adopted by his practising cults much later only from the late archaic period
